

The MSDOS window.

The MSDOS windows (shown below) doesn't close as nicely as a Windows window. Clicking on the 'X' to close the window will cause a second window to appear and you must click on the Yes button to exit the program.

The programs we are using in the file transfer demo are MSDOS files. Accidentally double-clicking on the file will cause them to run and display black background screens like the example shows.

A real simulation.

True MSDOS never ran in window. To get the real flavor of a DOS environment, press ALT+ENTER. The window border vanishes. Press ALT+ENTER again to return to a window screen.

Toggling through open applications.

ALT+TAB allows switching between a DOS and Windows screen. If you have several applications opened on your taskbar, you can toggle through the open applications by pressing and holding down the ALT key, then tap the TAB key. Each time you press TAB, a different application will appear in the dialog box. When you find the application you want to switch to, release the ALT key.
